COURSE RULES

USGA Rules apply except where modified by the following local rules:

OUT OF BOUNDS: Defined by white tipped posts and the inside edge of all public roads.

WATER HAZARDS: Defined by yellow stakes or lines. Players may elect to proceed to designated drop area after hitting tee shot into water hazard from any tee on Holes 7 and 8.

PROVISIONAL BALL: Water hazard (refer to Appendix 1, Part A, Rule 2)

LATERAL HAZARDS: Defined by red stakes or lines.

EMBEDDED BALL RULE: Through the green, a ball embedded in its own pitch mark in any ground other than sand may be lifted without penalty, cleaned, and dropped as near as possible to where it lay but not nearer the hole. When dropped, it must first strike part of the course through the green.

WASTE BUNKERS: Identified by blue stakes. Defined by a grey colored sand area; may have native vegetation growing within. Players may remove

loose impediments, ground their club, and take practice swings.

BUNKERS: Defined by a white sand area, and considered a hazard.

CART PATHS: All cocina shell cart paths are considered an integral part of the golf course. Players may remove loose impediments, ground their club, and take practice swings.

FLOWER BED RULE: Defined as ground under repair, and play from them is prohibited.

GOLF ETIQUETTE: Follow cart usage instructions/directional signs. Repair divots/ball marks. Smooth bunkers and replace rake in bunker.

SPRINKLER HEADS: Players may take free relief if a ball lies off the putting green but not in a hazard and such an obstruction on or within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole.

All yardages are measured from each tee marker to the center of the green.
